
How gaming elements strengthen education

Challenges


Think you've got what it takes? Challenges give students a sense of purpose, prompting them to take specific actions that drive further learning.

Badges, trophies, and stickers


Digital display cases help students look back on everything they've accomplished throughout their learning journeys with a sense of pride.
